Ken Nakajima, created the Kaiyushiki (strolling) garden, which is designed to embody the entire landscape of Japan, where every bend takes the visitor on a voyage of discovery.

The striking hill representing Mt Fuji, manicured hedges cascading across the garden like rolling hills, streams flowing like rivers and ponds glistening like inland lakes and the sea - ponder a moment or feed the Koi.

However, the Cowra Japanese Garden is unique in that it is more than just a 'Garden,' it is a powerful symbol of good will, it encourages reconciliation and peace. The Garden is designed in order to contribute to cultural exchange, international understanding and to show an appreciation of all existing nature.

Relax and take time to explore the Garden, the beauty and tranquillity amounts to an experience both spiritual and cultural. Visitors are welcome to bring a picnic or tantalise their taste buds in the Restaurant / café.
